There are many advantages of applying online:

- It's quick, easy, and secure.
- It's available 24 hours a day, seven days a week from: **1 September 2024**.
- You can apply from home, work, a library or from your mobile phone as long as you have an email address.
- You will get an email to confirm that your application has been received.
- The system helps you by checking for mistakes.
- You can view your application at any time.
- You can log on and view the offer on national offer day from 12.30am and receive an email later that day.

How do I decide which school to apply for?



Start exploring early

You must apply to the local authority that you live in

Allow yourself time to look at schools in your area, if you are unsure of the schools in your area please see appendix 2 for details of Barnsley Secondary schools. You can also visit our website www.barnsley.gov.uk/services/children-families-and-education/schools-and-learning/schools-in-barnsley/

You can also apply for schools that are not in Barnsley.

Finding information about a school

You can submit three choices on your application. Once you have a shortlist of schools, you can find out more about each one by visiting the school's website which will also detail their admissions arrangements. You may also find further information by visiting the school. All Barnsley secondary schools host open evenings for prospective parents, carers and children. These dates will be included in the information pack you will receive from School Admissions in September.

They can also be found on individual schools' websites.

Research and apply

You may wish to look at prospectuses, performance tables, and Ofsted reports, but remember they don't tell you everything about a school. Visit schools and then list them in order of preference on your application form. We also advise you to consider each school's admissions criteria to see if you're likely to get a place.

Get a complete picture

To get a full impression of a school, we recommend using more than just prospectuses, league tables and Ofsted reports. That's why we recommend you visit the school and see its location, facilities and surroundings. This will help you sense its learning atmosphere.



Considerations to make

- How will your child travel to and from your preferred school(s)? It is the parent/carer's responsibility to ensure that children get to school.
- We will try our best to offer you the school you prefer, but we cannot always do this. The demand for schools changes every year. Many schools are full, and will have more applicants than places available. We strongly recommend you apply for three schools and include the one nearest to your home.
- We also advise you to consider each school's admissions criteria to understand how places are allocated if more applications than places are received.
- Was the school oversubscribed in previous years?
- Which criteria will your child fall under? For example, do they have a sibling at the school already?
- How many places does the school offer? This is known as the Published Admission Number (PAN).

Oversubscribed schools

The secondary schools below were oversubscribed last year. This means there were more applications than there were places to offer. The distance in miles of the last place offered can also be found below.

How to apply

You must apply through the local authority where your child lives, regardless of where the school is located.

- 1** Visit www.barnsley.gov.uk/schooladmissions where you will need to create an account by entering your details.
- 2** Select your child from the list or click 'add new' and enter your child's details.
- 3** Select the correct admission round. There may be more than one you can apply for. You can apply to any school in England, up to a maximum of three schools. We highly recommend that you apply to as many schools as you can, as this will increase your chances of getting one of your preferred schools.

Barnsley schools do not operate catchment areas or feeder schools for admission to school.

- 4** Answer the questions about your child.
- 5** List the schools in the order you prefer, with your favourite school listed first. Your preference order is not disclosed to schools.
- 6** Select the reason you are choosing each school.
- 7** Review your application, then read the declaration.
- 8** Submit your application – you will receive an email confirmation.

1 Parent/carer details

The application should only be made by a person with parental responsibility for the child. This means a person with legal responsibility for making decisions about the child's welfare and education. Please include a daytime contact phone number.

If you are helping a parent apply online, please ensure their details are listed in this section, not yours.

If the child is in public care, the application should be made by the social worker.

2 Child's details

You must use your child's legal name. If you have changed their name legally please attach documentation.

If your child lives at a different address please ensure you enter their address – this must be in Barnsley, even if the schools you are choosing are outside Barnsley.

3 Admission round

Ensure you select the correct Admission Round. There may be more than one option. If you are unsure, please contact admissions.

4 Application details

Enter the name of your child's current school. If it is not in Barnsley you will need to click on advanced and change the Local Authority.

Please ensure that if you are applying for twins/triplets, you must submit one application per child and you must also tick the multiple birth box.

5 Select your preferences

List the schools in the order you prefer, with your favourite school listed first. The schools will not be told which other schools you have chosen, or where they come in the order of preference.

You can list three schools. It is a good idea to list your nearest schools. If you don't apply for any of the schools close to you, and you don't secure a place at one of your preferences, you may find local schools are already full. Your child could end up having to travel further away to get to school.

Barnsley Council **does not** operate catchment areas or feeder schools.

6 Preferences reasons

Select the reason you are choosing each school.

It is extremely important that if you are applying due to the reasons below that you tick the relevant box and complete any details required.

- Sibling
- Medical Social – not all schools have this in their admission arrangements
- Religion – not all schools have this in their admission arrangements
- Staff – not all schools have this in their admissions arrangements

7 Review and submit your application

Check that you have entered the correct details and are happy with the schools and the order.

Read the disclaimer and declaration – you have to tick the box to confirm.

Where separated parents have shared responsibility, only one application must be made and both parents must agree on which schools to apply for. Otherwise, this could delay or even stop the application process. If parents cannot agree, the application will be placed on hold until an agreement is reached, or a court order is issued.

Click the submit application button. You must ensure that you submit your application.

8 Application complete

You will receive an email confirmation which will detail your preferences in order.

If you would like to make a change you can click the finish button. You will see your application where you can 'unsubmit' make any amendments and then submit again.

If you cannot see the 'unsubmit' button please contact School Admissions for further advice.

The schools listed below require additional information to support the admissions process.

- **Barnsley Academy** – if you are applying under social medical reasons you will need to supply evidence. This can be attached to your online application or submitted directly to the school www.barnsley-academy.org/
- **Holy Trinity** – this school requires a SIF form to be completed if you are applying due to faith reasons www.holytrinitybarnsley.org/
Please note that if your child currently attends Holy Trinity in year 6 you do not need to apply for a place for year 7. If you wish to apply for a place at a different school please submit an application.
- **Trinity Academy St Edwards** – this school operates fair banding as part of their admissions arrangements stedwards.trinitymat.org

Applying under sibling criteria

If your child has a brother or sister (including step brother/sister and half brother/sister) living at the same address and attending any of your preferred schools, you must select 'sibling' as the reason for selecting the school. You must enter the sibling details, at the time of admission in:

September 2025

Please note a child in year 11 will not be classed as a sibling as they will not be attending the school when your child starts in: September 2025



Proof of home address

You must provide your current home address and council tax reference number. Details will be checked against Council Tax records. You will be asked to provide additional supporting documentation if we are unable to verify your details. It is important that you provide accurate information, as this can affect the outcome of your application.

If you are moving house you must use the address you are currently living at and inform admissions as soon as you move. You will need to provide evidence.

If you move after the closing date, you must inform admissions, however, we will use the address you were living at on the closing date to determine eligibility.

You must not use the address of a relative, friend, childminder or business.

Note: The offer of a school place can be withdrawn if the information supplied is knowingly incorrect. An admissions authority can also take legal action against anyone who has knowingly given false information to get a school place for their child.

Your child's home address

If you are separated from your child's other parent and your child lives partly with you and partly with the other parent, you should state the address where your child lives most of the time.

If your child splits their time 50/50 or if you have an equal shared care arrangement, you must use the GP registered address. You can upload a GP letter to your application to verify this.

What happens after you have submitted your form?

All forms will be considered together when submitted up to and including the closing date of: **30 November 2024**

Applications will be checked and verified by School Admissions or the school before processing for the following claims:

- Education Health and Care Plan, this is not the same as an Early Help referral.
- Currently or previously looked after – i.e. in public care.
- Address
- Siblings
- Religion
- Medical/Social
- Staff

Any claim we are unable to verify will be removed from your application.

Your child will be considered separately for each school you have applied for based on their application form. The schools do not know which other schools you have listed or the order you have listed them in.

If you do not fill in all the required forms or sit any required assessments you are unlikely to be offered a place at the school, even if siblings are attending.

If a school is not oversubscribed, every child who applies will be offered a place.

Barnsley Council is the admissions authority for all community and voluntary controlled schools. The authority will only admit up to the admission number for the school. Once the admission number has been reached no further offers will be made.

Oversubscription criteria for community and voluntary controlled schools

The list below indicates the order by which schools that are oversubscribed will prioritise applicants:

Children with an Education and Health Care Plan (EHCP) which names the school are required to be admitted.

- 1 Children currently and or previously looked after by a local authority.*
- 2 Children whose siblings will be attending the school on the proposed date of admission.
- 3 Distance to school from the child's home address. Measured in a straight line from the centre point of the child's ordinary place of residence to the main entrance of the school.**



*Looked After Children (LAC), Previously Looked After Children (PLAC), and children who have been in state care outside of England (IPLAC). A 'looked after child' is a child who is (a) in the care of a local authority, or (b) being provided with accommodation by a local authority in the exercise of their social care functions at the time of making an application to the school. Previously looked after children are children who were looked after, but ceased to be so because they were adopted (or became subject to a residence order or special guardianship order).

**Distance Criterion: Where the remaining place could be made for a number of eligible children who live an equal distance from the school, the offer will be by random allocation through the admissions team's automated system.

Parental dispute

In order to process an application, all parents/carers with parental responsibility for the child must agree on the school preferences. In situations where parents/carers cannot agree, school admissions are unable to process the application until all parties are in agreement, or a court order is issued stating the arrangements to be made for the child's education.

Changes after submission

If you would like to change your application after submission, please contact School Admissions who will advise you how to do this admissions@barnsley.gov.uk or **01226 773677**.

Applications received after closing date 30 November 2024

Applications received after the closing date will be deemed 'late applications' and will be considered after those received on time. If you wish to change your school preferences after the closing date, your application will be treated as late.

Applications will be considered together when received:

1 December 2024 – 2 March 2025

Applications will be processed in the order they are received from:

3 March 2025



National offer day

3 March 2025

You will be able to view the outcome of your application on the portal from 12.30am. In addition to this, you will receive an email with a copy of the outcome letter later that day.

To download the letter you will need to enter verification details. These must exactly match what we have on our system:

- 1 The email address used to apply
- 2 Your child's surname
- 3 Your child's date of birth

Your child will receive only one offer

If your child is eligible for a place at more than one school you will be offered your highest preference school, and all lower preferences will be withdrawn and released to other children. Therefore, please make sure you put the school you really want as first preference.

Please note: the admissions team are unable to give out offers over the phone. If you are unable to access your account on the portal or the letter sent via email, please email admissions@barnsley.gov.uk. This should be sent from the email address you applied with and must include your child's name, date of birth, address and what you would like to know.

Accepting the place offered

If you are happy with the school offered there is no need to accept the place. The school will be in touch in due course with further information regarding admission.

If you have accepted a place in a private or independent school for your child, please email admissions@barnsley.gov.uk as soon as possible so the place can be offered to another child.

I have not been offered one of my preferred schools

You will be allocated a school place at the next nearest school to your address that has vacancies.

You can choose to appeal against any school you have been refused for. You must complete a notice of appeal form and return to admissions@barnsley.gov.uk

How do waiting lists work

Your child will automatically be put on the waiting list for a school where they have not been made an offer of a place, and where that school is ranked higher than where an offer has been made.

Any vacancy which arises in year 7 will be filled from the waiting list. All parents need to be aware that their child's name will not automatically be placed on the waiting list for a school where it is ranked lower than the school for which they have received a single offer of a place.

The waiting list will be established on offer day and will be maintained to:

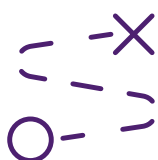
31 December 2025

Waiting lists for schools will be determined in accordance with the relevant oversubscription criteria.



Important points about waiting lists

- A vacancy only arises when the number of offers made falls below the Published Admission Number.
- Following offer day, should an application be received where the pupil has a higher priority as determined by the oversubscription criteria, they will be placed on the waiting list above those with a lower priority.
- If you choose to submit an appeal no weight is given to your child's place on the waiting list.
- If you have been refused a place at a school in another local authority area you must contact that authority for further information regarding waiting lists.
- If you would like to know your child's place on the waiting list please email school admissions.



Home to school transport

Parents and carers need to be aware that it is their responsibility to transport their child to and from school. However, there are a number of situations where the council provides assistance with travel and transport to school.

The council provides this assistance because it has a duty to do so as set out in law. The duty applies to home to school travel arrangements at the start of the day and school to home travel arrangements at the end of the day.

Assistance towards travel is provided to pupils under eight years of age who live more than two miles from the nearest available school and to pupils over the age of eight who live more than three miles from the nearest available school. The distance is measured by the shortest suitable walking route.

Travel assistance is also provided for low-income families whose children attend one of their three nearest secondary schools between two and six miles from their home and receive free school meals.

Transport for pupils with special needs is considered by the SEN Transport Panel following applications from parents.

If you think your child is eligible for free travel you should contact the School Transport team.

Children not entitled to free transport are subsidised towards the cost of transport through the concessionary fare scheme operated by South Yorkshire Mayoral Combined Authority (SYMCA).

The council is not responsible for commercial bus services and the operating companies can withdraw a service leaving pupils with no public transport to school. When selecting which schools you wish your child to attend you are advised to take account of the bus services and that alterations could be made.

What should I do if my child has special educational needs?

The majority of children and young people with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND) have their needs met within local mainstream schools. Some children may require additional support to access mainstream education, and some children may require a needs assessment in order for the council to decide whether it is necessary for it to make provision in accordance with an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP).

Where a school is named in the EHCP, in accordance with the council's procedures, the Authority will admit the child to the school.

A small number of secondary schools provide specialist facilities for children who have special educational needs, called Resourced Provisions. These can only be accessed if named in a child's EHCP.

Please note that if a school has an SEN resource provision, an application to that mainstream school does not guarantee a place in the resource provision. The EHC team will look at the most appropriate placement as part of the EHCP process. For enquiries regarding children with special educational needs telephone 01226 773966.

School SEND policy

Barnsley schools can provide support for your child.

Schools provide key information about what they have in place for children with SEND. It's usually found in their SEND policy.

The SEND policy can help parents/carers make an informed choice about the school their child attends.

It contains information about:

- the names, roles, and responsibilities of everyone at the school who are involved with providing for children with SEND
- how the school changes their teaching and makes sure that children with SEND make good progress
- how accessible the school is.

The SEND policy must be displayed on the school's website.

School admission appeals

If your child has been refused a place at any school named on your application or transfer form, you have the right to refer your case to an independent appeal panel who will review your appeal.

In order to appeal the decision you will need to complete a notice of appeal. This can be found on our website www.barnsley.gov.uk/schooladmissions.

The independent appeal process is a legal process and the decision is final.

Appeals for secondary school places have 2 stages. The first stage is where the school's case is presented to evidence why prejudice would be caused if any further children were to be admitted.

If the panel feel that prejudice would not be caused then all children appealing would be granted a place and that would be the end of the appeal.

If the panel agree that prejudice would be caused to the school, then the appeal moves to stage 2. This is where parents would present their case why they need a place for their child.

The panel will then make a decision in private and you will be informed in writing.

Summer born children

Parents of summer born children born between **1 April and 31 August** who do not feel that their child is ready to begin school before they reach compulsory school age can request that their child delays entrance into reception.

If your child had a delayed entry into primary school, for example due to being summer born, and is still educated outside their normal age group, you will need to apply for a delayed entry into secondary school when your child enters year 5.

Transferring schools

Transferring schools, other than at normal transition times, can be very disruptive to your child's education. The local authority coordinates all in-year applications for Barnsley schools.

You must complete an in-year application if your child:

- is transferring from one school to another
- has been educated at home and now wishes to apply for a school place
- has newly arrived in the UK and is looking for a school place

When should I apply?

We advise that you should make your application as soon as possible. We accept in-year applications one term in advance.

Fair Access Protocol

To comply with legislation Barnsley Council has a **Fair Access Protocol** with all the schools in the borough. This means that, in some circumstances, pupils defined in the Protocol will have a higher priority for admission than all other pupils seeking admission to that school.

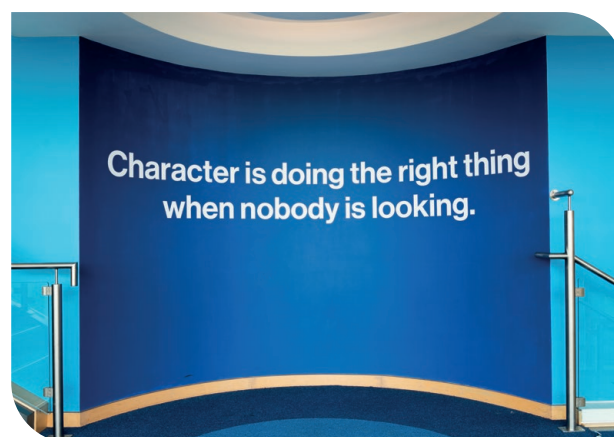

Penistone Grammar School is thriving. With first-class teaching, a 'values-driven' approach to learning and a strong school community, PGS provides an excellent educational experience for students from year 7 through to year 13.

Everything we do is driven by our core values (Aim High; Be Determined; Be Kind; Be Supportive; Be Proud) and is underpinned by honesty, integrity and respect. We believe the potential our students hold in terms of their personal achievement is limitless and our aim is to empower them so that they can go forward, prepared for whatever challenges they may face with absolute confidence, knowing they have the skills and qualities needed to succeed.

We are extremely proud of the academic success of our students and have cemented our position as one of the top secondary schools in the region. We pride ourselves on ensuring all our students are given the support they need to make excellent progress, regardless of their starting point or context. On average, students make nearly half a grade better progress than their peers nationally and over 81% of students left us last year with a grade 4 or higher in English and Mathematics at GCSE, with many students obtaining the new, elite, grade 9.

Our Post-16 provision is even more impressive. Student progress was once again outstanding with an ALPS 2 in 2022 which, according to ALPS, is recognised as 'Outstanding' and 'scoring between the 90th and 99th percentile' (within

the top 10% nationally). Our students have now achieved results in the within the top 10% nationally for five years in a row.

Of all grades achieved, 25% were A*, 55% were A*/A and 79% A*-B which are well above national and represent some of the best figures in South Yorkshire. The 'Average Points Score' for students was 45.02 which represents an average grade of an A. 14 students (nearly 10%) achieved 3 or 4 A*s. 98% of students secured a place at their university of choice with 53% of students achieving a place at a prestigious Russell Group university (over 4 times the national average). We had more students than ever achieve places at highly competitive universities or courses. Four students achieved a place to study at Oxbridge and a further eight were successful in achieving a place studying either medicine or veterinary medicine.

We are proud of our rich tradition of excellence, striving to achieve the highest standards and to be at the heart of our community. We are a happy school and we encourage our students to follow their interests, develop new skills and more importantly, fully enjoy everything that Penistone Grammar School has to offer.
