WHAT DOES THE YEAR 7 DAY LOOK LIKE?

All students enter the building through the side gate at the front of college from 8am. You follow the path around the building to the student entrance. Here, every morning the Year 7 team will meet you to check you are smart and organised for the day ahead.

You can then visit the college canteen where you can have breakfast with your friends. We have free items for all students – toast, bagel, cereal – or you can buy many other items like pancakes, bacon sandwiches and many more delicious items!

On your first day at Horizon, you will be given a timetable which tells you which lesson you have, when and where. Please don't worry about finding rooms – there are always lots of staff to help you find your way.


THE YEAR 7 DAY FOLLOWS THE TIMETABLE BELOW:

10:55am - 11:15am	BREAK – 20 minutes
11:15am - 12:20pm	Lesson three – 65 minutes
12:20 - 12:50pm	Lesson four – 30 minutes
12:50 - 1:25pm	Lunch (Year 7 Only)
1:25pm - 1:55pm	Lesson four – 30 minutes
1:55pm - 3:00pm	Lesson five – 65 minutes
3pm - 4pm	Enrichment Activities – Optional (but definitely recommended!)

WHAT IS FORM TIME AND WHAT DO WE DO?

Form time is the start of every day, and a great way to form new friendships. Your tutor will take your register, check you are ready for the day ahead and then lead on various activities such as Votes For Schools and the weekly student bulletin. Your tutor will also update you weekly on your attendance, achievement points and behaviour points.

We will also have a weekly assembly in the theatre where the whole year group comes together to discuss many topical areas such as Mental Health Awareness, Anti Bullying, LBGT+ Awareness and many others. We will also celebrate your successes in lessons every half term and your attendance.



WHO WILL BE IN MY FORM?

There will be 390 students in Year 7 which will split into 14 forms.

These forms are a mix of students from different primary schools. I do not ask for friendship groups, but I can assure you there will be at least one familiar face from your current primary school, (wherever possible).

Making new friends is a huge part of joining Horizon – there are so many students in Year 7 – everyone makes new friends, and if you are struggling, we are here to help you.

Just remember everyone is feeling the same, give it time and keep smiling.



WHAT LESSONS WILL I STUDY IN YEAR 7?

At Horizon we believe it is so important that you have experience of as many subjects as possible from Y7 through to Y9 (Key Stage 3). Once in Y9 you will then make choices as to which subjects you want to continue studying as GCSE or vocational courses in Y10 and Y11 (Key Stage 4).

Key Stage 3 is the first time you will study so many different subjects with specialist teachers, and also in specialist subject areas.

WILL I RECEIVE HOME LEARNING?

You will be set regular Home Learning in each of your subjects.

In most subjects, students are asked to carry out retrieval practice using their knowledge organisers which we will provide you in September. You then complete a 'retrieval quiz' online through Microsoft Teams. The purpose of this is to help you securely embed knowledge you already have, so that you remember this the next time you use it. This helps to make learning within lessons even more purposeful for you, as important knowledge is therefore 'readily available' to be added to, supporting rapid progress.







HOW WILL I GET TO HORIZON?

You will need to plan how you are going to travel to Horizon to ensure you are here on time for the start of your day.

Many of you may walk, but there are also 2 buses which service Horizon or you may decide to come on your bike.




- There are two buses which pull into Horizon at the start and end of the day

- We expect all students to abide by the bus company's rules whilst travelling on the bus. We want everyone to have a safe and pleasant journey to and from college.

BIKE

We encourage you to be active and healthy, so why not travel to Horizon by bike? We have secure bike shelters within the college grounds where you can bring your bike lock and fasten your bike up for the day. Please ensure you know the safest route to travel, Horizon is on a very busy road and we want all students to be safe.



WHAT WILL I WEAR?



We want you to wear the Horizon uniform with pride and we expect all students to wear it correctly.

KEY THINGS TO REMEMBER:

The skirt is knee length, the trousers are traditional in style – not skinny fit, not chino and we do not allow leggings.

Please look carefully at the guidance around shoes – we do check all uniform items every morning when you arrive. If your uniform is not as expected, we are happy to loan items while you purchase the correct ones if you are having trouble, so that you can attend lessons looking smart and ready for the day ahead.

We allow one ring, a watch and two pairs of small stud earrings – no other piercings are allowed and will have to be removed before the school day commences.

Makeup should be natural and discreet, and this is also the same for nails and lashes. We do not allow nail or lash extensions.

We also have a selection of pre-loved items available to purchase when you visit in June for the Transition Evening.


IS ATTENDANCE AND PUNCTUALITY IMPORTANT?

Attendance each and every school day is compulsory. If you are not in school then you must have a justifiable reason for your absence.



Parents/Carers should inform the school absence line on the first day of your absence via telephone and every day there after.

If you need to make an appointment, for example to see a GP, ask that this is made outside of the school day wherever possible.



PUNCTUALITY

Punctuality is an important part of self-discipline and is essential to good time management.

Always make sure that you are in the appropriate classroom no later than the times shown in the section on timing of the school day.

If you arrive late for school, five times, you will be given a detention on the next available detention day.

If you arrive late to school you must sign in at the student reception desk. You will be marked as late in the register and will need a note explaining the reason for your late arrival.

If you arrive over an hour late it will be recorded as an unauthorised absence. This will impact your attendance. All unexplained absences shall be followed up by staff in the attendance office with a call home.



WHAT DO I NEED TO BRING EACH DAY?

Every student you are expected to have a school bag so you can be organsied and ready for your learning. Your bag needs to be strong enough to carry your exercise books and PE kit, so choose wisely!

Packing your bag the night before the day ahead, is a good routine.

Inside your bag you will need the following items:

Equipment - pen (black and purple), pencil, ruler, eraser, scientific calculator

Horizon planner – given to you in September

Reading book - your choice

Exercise books for the day

PE kit for lesson or enrichment activities

CAN I BRING MY MOBILE PHONE TO HORIZON?

We know that many of you may find it useful to bring a mobile phone to college so you can check in with your parents or carers on your way home.

However, mobile phones **must not** be used or seen throughout the college day, and this does include break and lunchtime.

They must be in your school bag and turned off. You are responsible for the safe keeping of your phone.


If you did need to contact home, we have a student reception who can help with this.

If you are seen with your mobile phone out during the school day, it will be confiscated and taken to student reception where you will then collect it at the end of the day.



CHARACTER IN THE CLASSROOM

You are encouraged to reflect and develop your 'character within the classroom'. This involves you taking ownership and responsibility of your learning, having high expectations of yourself and developing a positive, growth mindset. Your planner identifies important characters and qualities that we feel you should aim to demonstrate at every opportunity. All staff will encourage you to develop 'character in the classroom' which in turn supports our ethos of you becoming a 'positive role model'.



Three afternoons a week we encourage all student to participate in enrichment activities. There is such a wide variety to choose from, there really should be something for everyone!

These run for 1 hour at the end of each day, are completely free and you can attend as many as you like!

Below is an example from this year, so you can see just how much is on offer for you to get involved in!



At lunchtime we also have activities that you can join in to ensure we really are making the most of every minute! You can go up to the library for themed daily events such as Magazine Mondays, play interform football on the Muga or hit the theatre for just dance.

At Horizon we believe in rewarding attendance, effort, achievement and much more!

Your classroom teachers will award you with achievement points in your lessons – this may be for outstanding home-learning, positive verbal contributions, outstanding effort towards a piece of work or for demonstrating one of the 6 core values. Your teachers may send a postcard home, always a lovely surprise when they land on your doormat!

You may also receive positive conduct points which are given for showing kindness, going above normal expectations, helping other, respect for the college building and being a positive role model.

Achievement points and conduct points are accumulated together and we then have praise thresholds for you to aspire to:

100	200 300 450
Bronze Award	When students receive 100 net points, they are awarded their Bronze Award. They are presented with their Bronze certificate in form period and a text message is sent home.
Silver Award	When students receive 200 net points, they are awarded their Silver Award. The Silver Award certificate is presented in assembly and a postcard is sent home.
Gold Award	When students receive 300 net points, they are awarded their Gold Award. The Gold Award certificate is presented in the Principal's office and a congratulations letter is sent home. Once students receive their Gold Award they are also invited on the whole school rewards trip at the end of the academic year.
Platinum Award	When students receive 450 net points, they are awarded their Platinum Award. The Platinum Award certificate is presented in the Principal's office and a congratulations letter is sent home. Students will be invited to join the Principal and their Head of Year for an afternoon tea in the summer term to recognise their fantastic efforts.

- Each half term we will have two celebration assemblies one for attendance and one for outstanding character. In these assemblies there will be gift vouchers for the lucky students who are picked from the prize draw.
- During the year your teachers will report on your effort and progress in lessons. We reward the students in the top 10% for effort with a gold pin badge to recognise their outstanding achievements. We also treat these students to a cooked breakfast with their own reserved seating in the dining hall.
- At the end of each term the Principal awards a certificate to one student in each year group. This student is selected based upon effort across all subjects, involvement in college life, representing the college at a local/national event and many other contributions that make that student 'stand out' as positive role models.
- Finally we encourage all students to visit our Praise Tuesday and Proud Thursday table during lunchtime. We want you to be proud of your work, so we invite you to bring a piece of work to share with a member of staff and then take a certificate home to share with your family.



You can buy food and drinks at breakfast, break and lunchtime. You will do this using your Parentmail account that your parents will set up for you.

Your parents/carers will be able to do this on the 1st September so it is ready for you starting. We will send your parents/carers details when this is ready.

At lunchtime, Year 7 have the dining hall and cafe area all to yourselves, and this also includes all the outdoor space. Other year groups are in lessons!

We upload this onto the college website weekly so that you can choose what you would like to eat before you even get to college!



WHEN CAN I VISIT HORIZON?

Every student will be invited to visit Horizon before the Summer Holidays. You will spend one day moving around one area of the college, experiencing lessons at Horizon and meeting new people.

The provisional dates are 4th and 9th July and we will be in touch with your primary school to organise which day you will visit.

YOUR FIRST DAY AT HORIZON

- Receive a **free** lunch so no-one needs to worry about their parentmail account and how to use this.
